

Looking for a treatment option for your itchy dog?



Is your dog scratching? Does your dog keep you up at night with sounds of chewing and licking? These could be signs of atopic dermatitis, which is a chronic skin condition associated with environmental allergies. **Answer the questions below and share your responses with your veterinarian.** Together you can find the cause of the itch and treatment options that work—for your dog, and for you.

Signs of possible atopic dermatitis:

- My dog frequently scratches, licks, chews, bites, rubs, and/or scoots Y N S
- My dog behaves this way only during specific times of the year or all year round Y N S
- My dog has hair loss, a rash or skin that is itchy, red, scaly or irritated Y N S
- My dog has experienced ear irritation/infections or skin infections, or recurrent ear problems Y N S

Impact on quality of life:

- My dog isn't as happy or content due to all the scratching Y N S

- Sleep has been an issue for my dog and that has affected our lives as well Y N S
